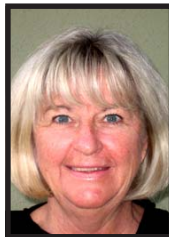

REPRESENTING BUSINESS TO GOVERNMENT

Frankly Speaking

A Government Issue Update of Interest to the CVCC Membership

June 2012 Ballot Measures:

As of April 9, 2012, three measures have made the June 5, local primary election ballot. One measure is a two-part parcel tax that favors the Santa Barbara Unified School District. However the other two should be of interest to local business owners.

■ **Proposition 28:** is the “*Term Limit Reform Act of 2012.*” Under the legal description the act reduces the total amount of time a person may serve in the state legislature from 14 to 12 years. It allows a person to serve a total of 12 years either in the Assembly, the Senate, or a combination of both. This act applies only to legislators first elected after the measure is passed. **Opponents to this measure** are the CA Republican Party and the National Tax Limitation Committee. Those, who have indicated that they support Prop 28 are: the LA Area Chamber of Commerce; the LA County Federation of

Labor; CalChamber; the Valley Industry & Commerce Association; Common Cause; the Oxnard, Camarillo and Simi Valley Chambers of Commerce. You may access addition information about the supporters at www.cafreshstart.com.

■ **Proposition 29:** is the “*CA Cancer Research Act of 2012.*” The legal description states that this proposition imposes an additional \$1/pack tax increase on cigarettes to fund research and research facilities focused on detecting, preventing, treating and curing cancer, heart disease, emphysema and other tobacco-related diseases, in addition to financing prevention programs. **Opponents to this measure include:** CalChamber, the Calif. Manufacturers & Tech. Assn.; the Calif. Grocers Assn.; the Small Business Action Committee; the Ventura County Taxpayers Assn.; the Oxnard, Camarillo and Simi Valley Chambers of Commerce.

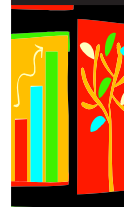

ABOP is an acronym for Anti-freeze, Batteries, Oil, and Paint (latex only), used to describe materials that are collected, at no charge, for recycling throughout the year. Carpinteria City residents can bring in the following materials for recycling, at no charge:

- Antifreeze
- Batteries (limit two per person)
- Motor oil and oil filters
- Water-based paints

The ABOP collection facility, located at City Hall, 5775 Carpinteria Avenue, is open every second and fourth Saturday of the month, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The only exceptions are in November and December, when the facility is open only the second Saturday of each month

There is a five-gallon limit per person on oil, antifreeze and water-based paints

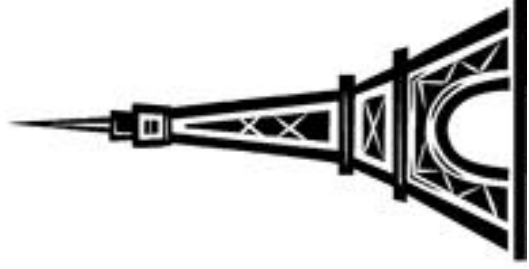
